Romans 12:9-21

⁹Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; ¹⁰love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

¹⁴Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. ¹⁷Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. ¹⁸If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. ¹⁹Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." ²⁰No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." ²¹Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

What if we actually strived to live as God's word invites us to live?

What motivates us as the body of Christ to read scripture? How do we use God's word? Is there practical application? Does it make any difference?

As I take time to read, study, and digest God's word, it challenges me to expand my view of how God interacts in my life and how God challenges me to interact in the lives of those around me. If we accept that God's word is God breathed, then we should also accept His word should influence every aspect of our lives. I see it as the ideal set before us. God's word invites us to go and grow; to see God's possibilities and be motivated; to accept this challenge to become Christ-like. Many will say, I am not there. I would respond that this is good because if we know where we are then we can be challenged to become who God wants us to be.

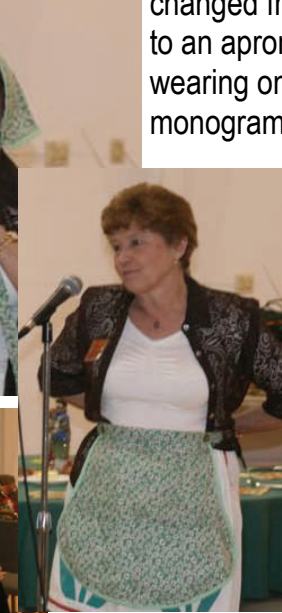


changed from a bonnet to an apron. Margo was wearing one monogrammed by Cheryl

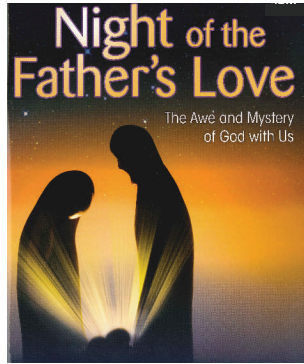
THANKSGIVING

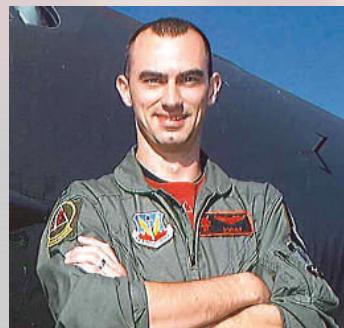
MORGAN-SCOTT TOYS

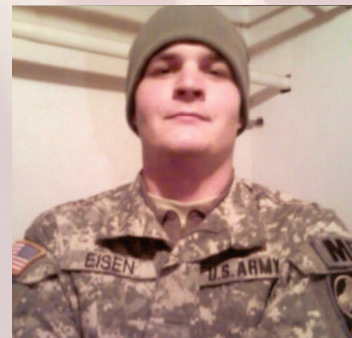

UMW -- DON'T FORGET

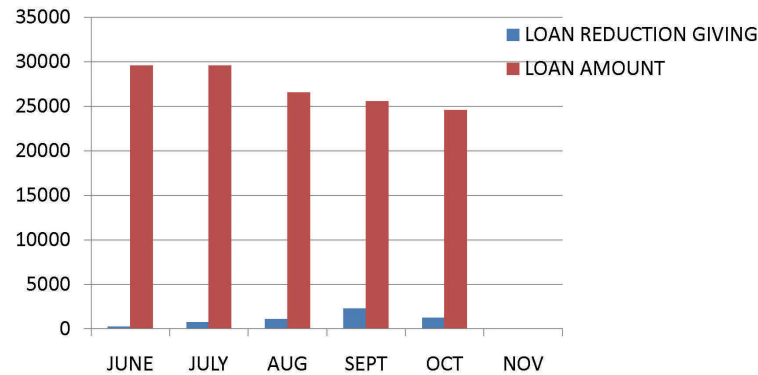
