Running the Race

In John 17, Jesus is praying just before his betrayal and arrest. Jesus' prayer is for his disciples, and all future disciples that they may be one just as Jesus and the Father are one. Jesus says that he has given disciples the glory that the Father gave to Jesus, and he prays for us to be in unity so that the world will know that the Father sent Jesus. This is what Jesus prayed as he was about to enter a dark night of his soul.

We seem to be in a dark night of our souls now. We are experiencing a pestilence upon the earth, political divide over almost every issue we face, and even divide within the Church of Jesus Christ. If ever there was a time to be called to prayer, it is now. Jesus gave us a mission to go make disciples, his last physical words on earth being, "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8, NRSV). As we claim the name of Christianity, everything we say and everything we do is a witness and testimony to Jesus Christ. Lord, forgive me for those times my witness has not been true to the gospel of Jesus Christ.

There have been times when I willfully avoided fulfilling the call of Christ on my life, and there have been other times when I heard the call, wanted to follow but didn't really know how. I suppose the not knowing how stems from my own not abiding in the vine as Jesus refers to it. Even in this time of social distancing, we still have the call to make disciples. Maybe I should say, most especially in this time of angst and searching and discontentment, we have a call to make new disciples and to strengthen existing disciples.

As I continue thinking about transformation, I realize we are in a season now where we need to be abiding in Jesus and seeking Him through prayer. Prayer for our church, for our schools, for our law enforcement, for our government, and for our young people. I am especially burdened for those who will grow up not having experienced the joys of high school or college that so many of us remember all because our world has changed so drastically in 2020.

Through these trying times let us remember that our mission is Jesus—unmistakably, undeniably Jesus. That means we pray as Jesus prayed; we preach the good news as Jesus preached; we serve as Jesus served. Our unity comes through our shared passion for making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

While it is not yet safe to gather in person, there is still much to be done as we seek transformation within our own souls and within our church and community. If our mission is Jesus, then how do we go about sharing Jesus with the world? We begin in prayer. We have a great opportunity as school starts to pray for our young people.

Forty to fifty percent of students from good youth groups and families will drift from God and the church after high school. Why is that you might ask? Maybe it is because the enemy is fighting for their souls, and we have not equipped them well enough to fight back. Maybe it has to do with not feeling a part of the greater community of believers. Maybe it's a bit of both. At any rate our young people need to know that we truly care, and they desperately need our prayers. Every young person needs a team of adults strategically investing in their lives through prayer. That's why I am asking you to engage in a "Pray for Me" campaign throughout this coming year.

The Pray for Me Campaign links the generations in our community through prayer. During the campaign, adult believers from various generations become Prayer Champions and commit to a year of prayer for one student or family with young children.

The Pray for Me Prayer Guide equips the Prayer Champions to pray specific, Scripture-based prayers for children or students through the lens of the 7 Essentials found in each guide.

The 7 Essentials that represent seven aspects of life that are necessary for someone to flourish in living faithfully before God and humanity include favor, wisdom, love, faith, purity, speech, and conduct. Prayer Champions praying through the 7 Essentials will ask for God to intercede on behalf of children and students in the next generation.

You are there for people who are impacted by disasters when you give to UMCOR.



Due to the illness of our presenter in August, we will again share this

book, which is appropriate for today's world.

Finding Peace in an Anxious World, the 2020 Spiritual Growth Study by staff of the Urban Village Church, uses the book of Proverbs and "The Serenity Prayer" as a guide to help Christians find their way through anxiety, worry, and fear and move towards God's peace that surpasses all understanding. Using "The Serenity Prayer" as a scaffold, Finding Peace in an Anxious World explores ways to discover peace through scriptural and spiritual disciplines so that we can be rooted in God and energized to live fully as disciples of Christ.

"The Serenity Prayer" shaped a 2015 four-part sermon series at the Urban Village Church in Chicago. It was through that series that the church was able to address the tumultuous events of that summer and present a framework for how to approach a God who desires peace for the hearts of God's people in times of anxiety. These sermons are the basis for this book
