Lenten Focus on the Psalms and Ash Wednesday Worship

The pandemic of 2020 has had many unintended consequences. It will take years to even begin to grasp them all and create remedies and course corrections. There's one we must deal with now. The people of God have stopped singing. Sure, we are doing our best, but with all the masks and distancing and watching worship service on screens, our singing has taken a big hit. For the 2021 Lenten season, we want to speak into (and sing into) this moment.

During the season of Lent I want to invite you to join me in singing the psalms.

My colleague, J.D. Walt has been working on a resource for Lent we call *Soundtrack*. It's a Forty-Day Playlist through the Psalms. Long before now, we lost the concept that the word "psalm" actually means "song." Somewhere along the way we stopped singing them. Imagine only reciting the words to your favorite songs and never actually singing them. That's what we've come to do with the psalms.

This is so perfect for now, because so many of the psalms are actually made for the moment we now face—the space between great loss and a great awakening. So, I want to ask you to consider joining us in this Lenten journey.

We start singing on Ash Wednesday. You may get this playlist as a daily email by signing up at

https://www.seedbed.com/daily-text/ or order the book from https://my.seedbed.com/product/soundtrack-a-forty-day-playlist-through-the-psalms/ (in paper or e-book format that will include a musical soundtrack with recordings of the songs to help you).

Speaking of Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent on, **February 17**, Lent is a 40-day journey of fasting (not counting Sundays which are always feast days) as we prepare ourselves for the feast and celebration of Easter. Just like we have done everything in the past year with social distancing, we will have to adjust on Ash Wednesday too. In the midst of the chaos and uncertainty, God is still making a way for us to come together. Never before in our lifetimes have we experienced such a protracted period of crisis. And never before have we experienced such a profound opportunity for awakening.

New Room Chapel is the oldest Methodist Chapel, and the chapel where John Wesley preached in Bristol, England that led to an awakening to Jesus Christ spread across the land. I have been blessed for the past few years to be a part of a New Room Conference, named after that historic chapel in Bristol The purpose has been to seek a great awakening in our time.

We will have an opportunity to attend one of those meetings on Ash Wednesday by livestream: **A Night with New Room – Ash Wednesday**, 8:00-10:00 PM Eastern Time. This will be a live-streamed gathering focused around confession, repentance, and returning to the Lord with all our hearts.

In the wake of much death, we need to be together and claim resurrection life as we head into the 40 days to the cross. Through crisis, I believe the Lord is opening a door for us that cannot be closed—a doorway into a sustained season of awakening. We must walk through it together.

You can register to participate from home, or you may join us in the sanctuary for the broadcast (following our COVID protocols).

New Room Conference encourages each and every person attending register at

https://newroomconference.com/. Registration allows them to provide each participant with complimentary follow up materials and links to the talks should you for any reason miss a portion or would like to view them again. Please note that the times on the web page are Central Time and therefore it will be an hour later in Eastern.

You may still participate in the sanctuary without registration (and without access to the bonus materials) but we would like to have an estimated number of participants, so please call Janie in the church office if you plan to attend in the sanctuary. We will have a time for "imposition of ashes" that will be an ashen cross on a piece of sackcloth.

For those who want to join at home or for whom this opportunity will not work, we will have the sanctuary open 1-5 PM that day for prayer and will have an Ash Wednesday devotional from the Soundtrack publication printed for you along with a piece of sack-cloth with the ashen cross on it for you to keep throughout Lent.

Nothing has the power to unite people and generations like singing the Word of God.

It's time we start singing the Psalms again.
