## **RUNNING THE RACE**

I write this on Earth Day. I have enjoyed sitting on the front porch of the parsonage this spring gazing upon the flowering dogwoods, wisteria, black cherry, redbuds, roses, and burning bush (I didn't even know burning bushes bloomed). I join with creation singing the praises of the Creator. When God created the world. He said it was good. Then God created human beings in the image of God and called it very good and told Adam and Eve, "Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it." (Genesis 1:28). In the Garden of Eden, humanity and all of creation lived together in peace and harmony, and a river flowed from the garden to water the earth branching into four branches. Then humanity introduced sin, and as a result the ground is cursed (Genesis 3:17). Harmony became discord. Death replaced life. Chaos ensued (the next chapter is Cain murdering Abel). The rest of the biblical story is the story of redemption: God working to redeem a fallen humanity and a fallen world. Paul tells the Christians in Rome, "For we know that all creation has been groaning as in the pains of childbirth right up to the present time" (Romans 8:22).

Look at the word *govern*. According to Webster's Dictionary, *govern* means to rule without sovereign power and usually without having the authority to determine basic policy. Other translations say *steward*, meaning one who is hired to manage. The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it. The world and all its people belong to him (Psalm 24:1).

On New Year's Day 2005, David Yonggi Cho, founding pastor of the world's largest church, confessed:

The Bible says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not parish but have eternal life." All these years I misinterpreted it. I understood that God so loved *human beings*, not *the world*, that he gave his only Son. What is the world? In the world, there are all things such as people, society, sky, land, ocean, plants, insect and animals. The Bible says that God so loved the *world* that he gave his only Son; it does not limit the scope of the world to human beings.<sup>1</sup>

Redemption is about restoring Eden. Revelation 22:1-2 gives us a picture of what that looks like: a crystal-clear river with the water of life flowing from the throne of God and flowing down the center of the main street, with a tree of life growing on each side of the river, bearing twelve crops of fruit, with a fresh crop each month. The leaves were used for medicine to heal the nations.

We live in a time of tension between the already and not-yet. We are a fallen race in the process of redemption. Ephesians 1:10 says that at the right time everything in heaven and on earth will be brought together under the authority of Christ. Until that right time, we have a responsibility to be faithful to God's call to govern, or steward, God's creation. Let us become passionate about salvation: salvation of both human souls and all God's creation.



Bryan Massengale played "Adagio in G Minor" on the organ for the special music on March 28<sup>th</sup>.




Angela Jackson, and guest Brian Minshew, sang "I've Just Seen Jesus" for the special music on Easter Sunday.



Bryan Massengale played "Alone with the Music" on the piano for the special music on April 11<sup>th</sup>.


### Come join the United Methodist Women Book Club

On May 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 in the Fellowship Hall



Whether looking back to a troubled past or welcoming a hopeful future, the powerful voices of Indigenous women across North America resound in this book.

In the same style as the best-selling Dreaming in Indian, #NotYourPrincess presents an eclectic collection of poems, essays, interviews, and art that combine to express the experience of being a Native woman. Stories of abuse, humiliation, and stereotyping are countered by the voices of passionate women making themselves heard and demanding change. Sometimes angry, often reflective, but always strong, the women in this book will give teen readers insight into the lives of women who, for so long, have been virtually invisible.



Garrett Morgan, a prolific African American inventor and entrepreneur, must test his latest invention in a daring rescue after an explosion at the Cleveland Waterworks.

If a man puts something to block your way, the first time you go around it, the second time you go over it, and the third time you go through it.

Living by these words made inventor and entrepreneur Garrett Morgan unstoppable! Growing up in Claysville, Kentucky, the son of freed slaves, young and curious Garrett was eager for life beyond his family's farm. At age fourteen, he moved north to Cleveland, where his creative mind took flight amidst the city's booming clothing-manufacturing industry. Using his ingenuity and tenacity, Garrett overcame racial barriers and forged a career as a successful businessman and inventor. But when a tunnel collapsed, trapping twenty men, the rescue would test both Garrett's invention -- and his courage.

### **2021 Hands on Mission Project**

Below are the instructions for making a kit. It is very important that all items are exactly the size that is specified.

Pack these items in a 2-gallon Ziploc bag (DO NOT use a

larger size bag):

- 1 hand towel
- 1 washcloth
- 2 toothbrushes
- 2 tubes of toothpaste (6.4 oz or less)
- 1 bottle of shampoo (15 oz or less)
- 1 bottle of lotion (18 oz or less)
- 1 bottle of roll-on deodorant (4 oz or less)
- 1 small spray perfume/cologne/body mist (4 oz or less)

Pack these items in a separate, sandwich size Ziploc bag:

- 1 tube of antibacterial ointment (1 oz)
- 1 bottle of Tylenol/Acetaminophen 500 mg (24 ct.)

Shipping is \$5 per kit. Make checks out to SCUMC.

Kits can be brought by the church office or placed in the box at the Side Entrance by May 23rd.
