Running the Race

Spring is here, and there is new life all around. Tender green leaves that are following white and yellow and pink flowers. The birds are singing. How appropriate that we will celebrate the new life we have in Jesus because of Easter in a couple of weeks. Here is the Easter story from something to show them, so God made sure the stone the Gospel according to Mark (*The Message* translation):

16 ¹⁻³ When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so they could embalm him. Very early on Sunday morning, as the sun rose, they went to the tomb. They worried out loud to each other, "Who will roll back the stone from the tomb for us?" 4-5 Then they looked up, saw that it had been rolled back—it was a huge stone—and walked right in. They saw a young man sitting on the right side, dressed all in white. They were completely taken aback. astonished.

⁶⁻⁷ He said, "Don't be afraid. I know you're looking for Jesus the Nazarene, the One they nailed on the cross. He's been raised up; he's here no longer. You can see for yourselves that the place is empty. Now—on your way. Tell his disciples and Peter that he is going on ahead of you to Galilee. You'll see him there, exactly as he said." ⁸ They got out as fast as they could, beside themselves, their heads swimming. Stunned, they said nothing to anyone.

The story is told over and over again, and it never gets old. When I read it this time, I see three things that stand out. First, "They worried out loud to each other, "Who will roll back the stone from the tomb for us?" No doubt these three women wondered how they were to complete the task before them with such a huge stone to roll out of the way. Can't you imagine the conversation and the planning of what they would try when that arrived? God had was not an hindrance for them.

Second, "Tell his disciples and Peter that he is going on ahead of you to Galilee." These women were to preach the Gospel to the rest of the disciples, and Jesus was going ahead of them. All they had to do was tell what they had seen and heard. Jesus would do the rest.

Third, they were to go and tell. They had to take action. The text says that they said nothing to anyone, because their heads were swimming and they were stunned. The New Living Translation says they were overcome with terror and dread. Yet, we know from the other gospel accounts that they did indeed tell.

We, too, need to be prepared to tell. Sometimes we do so with fear and trembling. After-all, proclaiming the gospel is a high and holy task, but we also remember that we tell our experience, knowing that Jesus goes ahead of us (prevenient grace of God) to prepare those who will hear. We can also know that if God calls us to action, God will make a way for us to accomplish the action. So let us be bold in telling the gospel to those who need to hear it this Easter season, but if we don't tell, how will they know?
