He rehearsed what he was going to tell his father when he arrived. He had his story. Returning home, when he was attempting to convince his father, his father responded to him with hugs, love, and compassion. He welcomed his prodigal son.

Homecoming means WE are all always welcomed and can always come home. The Father is waiting; come home!



But for Fr. Beltran, who served for three decades as a chaplain to the scavengers who survive off this reeking heap, it is also a metaphor of hope an emblem of the will to survive, the ability to create joy and find meaning even in the midst of abject poverty. Faith and Struggle on Smokey Mountain describes the spiritual resilience of the scavengers of Smokey Mountain, and how they taught Beltran to read the Gospel with new eyes. The lessons he learned bear a message for all who struggle for a better world.


