<sup>5</sup>Now a certain man was there who had an infirmity thirty-eight years. <sup>6</sup>When Jesus saw him lying there, and knew that he already had been in that condition a long time, He said to him, "Do you want to be made well?" <sup>7</sup>The sick man answered Him, "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; but while I am coming, another steps down before me." <sup>8</sup>Jesus said to him, "Rise, take up your bed and walk." <sup>9</sup>And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked.

How often we find in the Gospels stories about Jesus and His encounter with people who have great needs.

It is interesting that when Jesus meets these people, they all seem to have their own agenda. They want Jesus to do something for them, but they want it done their way. In almost every case. Jesus takes their situation to a higher level. Many times He uses their situation to help them better understand God and His kingdom.

In this story, the man has waited for thirty eight years to be healed. It seems that he has lost all hope, focus, and faith. The man has become bitter with his life and is wallowing in self-pity. When Jesus comes, He asks the man if he wants to be made well. Perhaps surprised by the question, the man begins to complain about his situation. We know Jesus has the solution for him; all he has to do is respond and obey.

Never underestimate what God will do. By example of this story, we need to realize God will make us well in His will, His way, and His time!
