# Dale's Doodles

Matthew 6: 25-33, 25

"Therefore I tell vou. do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? 26 Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and vet vour heavenly Father feeds them. Are vou not of more value than they? 27 And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? 28 And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, 29 vet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. 30 But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven. will he not much more clothe vou-vou of little faith? 31 Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' 32 For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. 33 But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

Trusting God is a challenge at times. We are encouraged to place our full trust in God for all things. Trust is a word that we use and sometimes overuse when we are very willing to tell others about how they need to trust God in their life's situations. When we journey through life and encounter bumps (and some of these can be huge bumps), trust becomes more than a word; it becomes a part of our life's experience. Trust becomes an act in which we begin to participate in because of our reliance on God in all things.

It is amazing to me how God allows things into our lives that cause us to look honestly at ourselves and affirm that we are trusting Him in all things. It is easy to say, "I trust," and it is a challenge to do it. When we get to that point in our relationship with God, at that moment, there is this new freedom we will experience. It is a new freedom that allows us to grow spiritually. It is a statement of our faith.

Trusting God takes the focus off the situation and allows us to experience the wondrous power of God. This connection with God strengthens our walk, energizes our witness, and maintains our faith.

# Dining on the Mountain







# **February 26, 2020**

The real meaning of Lent is Ash Wednesday, the day after Mardi Gras, which begins with a service where we recognize our mortality, repent of our sins, and re-turn our lives towards Jesus Christ. Many of us commit to changing our lives over the forty days of Lent so that we might be more like Christ. In the Ash Wednesday service, a minister marks the sign of the cross on a person's forehead with ashes.

In Jewish and Christian history, ashes are a sign of mortality and repentance. When we die, our bodies eventually decompose and we become dust/dirt/ash. A long time ago, when people felt remorse for their sins, they would put ashes on their heads and wear "sackcloth" (scratchy material) to remind them that sin is uncomfortable.

Lent is a great time to repent and return to God and re-focus our lives to be more in line with Jesus. It is easy for us to get caught up in the drama of classes, relationships, family, work, politics, food, alcohol, meaningless chatter, too many meetings, activities, etc., or anything that takes us away from living our lives for Christ.

Christians may also use the 40 days of Lent as a time of prayer. We can pray while we walk, drive, work and become more in tune with God.

Join us for our Ash Wednesday Service beginning at seven o'clock Wednesday evening, February 26th, in the Sanctuary with Dr. Mike Jackson, preaching. (Pastor Dale leaves for the Holy Land, Tuesday, February 25th). Please be in prayer for Dr. Jackson as he directs our Ash Wednesday Service and for safe travel for Pastor Dale.
