RUNNING THE RACE

It is hard to believe that it was a year ago when we moved to Spring City. Let me say that I am excited to begin a second year here. While it has been weird and difficult, I will also say we have been blessed. I have seen the hand of God at work in so many ways. So thank you for receiving my family and me, and thank you for the opportunities for growth that you have faithfully given even when it seemed we weren't really doing much.

Now I get to begin again as your new pastor. We get to start over. We get to experiment. We get to explore. As we begin exploring, I am brought to Psalm 78. Verses 4-8 say:

We will not hide these truths from our children; we will tell the next generation about the glorious deeds of the LORD, about his power and his mighty wonders.
 For he issued his laws to Jacob;

he gave his instructions to Israel.
He commanded our ancestors

to teach them to their children,

6 so the next generation might know them even the children not yet born and they in turn will teach their own children.

⁷ So each generation should set its hope anew on God, not forgetting his glorious miracles and obeying his commands.

8 Then they will not be like their ancestors stubborn, rebellious, and unfaithful, refusing to give their hearts to God.

I want to celebrate our next generation this summer. I remember summers as a child and the fun and wonderment that I experienced: playing in the rain and mud; picking blackberries that rarely made their way into the bucket; playing in the yard and

getting stung by bees (not one of my favorite memories, but a memory none-the-less); playing into the evening when we could catch fireflies last thing before bedtime; picnics and barbecues; and camp and VBS. I am celebrating that my children are all at Camp Lookout this summer as either camper or staff—the same camp I was a camper and staff at, but I am missing VBS. Not to worry...we have a plan.

I think the remainder of this year needs to be focused on telling God's marvelous story to future generations so that they will, in turn, teach those stories to yet more future generations. There is no more nobler task than to raise up children in the way of the Lord so that when they are old, they will not depart from Him, so let us focus on others who need to know Jesus. While we have gone for the past year or more without children and youth activities, we are re-launching. By the time you read this, the youth will have gathered at the parsonage and likely will have had some other summer activities to celebrate youthful summers. Then we will kick off youth meeting regularly with the start of school.

Speaking of school, we are having a back-to-school bash on Saturday, August 7. From 1-4 p.m. we will have a time for pre-K through 5th graders to worship, learn, and play. Our theme will be "*Who Knew?*" and will be centered around Luke 2:52, "Jesus grew in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and all the people." We will have stories about young people who grew into people of importance. We will have crafts and games and music and dancing, and make your own snack. And we will worship. We have coordinators for each area, but they will need your help. We want to all be a part in whatever way we can so we can introduce new families to our extended family at SCUMC. We will end the evening with a special time for youth at 5:00 p.m.

We spent the past year praying for children and youth through our Pray for Me campaign. Let us engage in praying with our young people for this coming school year. We will always need to connect our older generations with our younger generations and pray for each other. Pray for Me is a plan to connect older adults, middle adults, and young adults with students/families. We will provide prayer guides for prayer champions who don't already have one. We will have children who are 5th grade and younger connect with prayer champions as a family unit. Youth in grades 6th-12th grade will seek out prayer champions as individuals. Prayer champions will be asked to pray daily for their student and connect with them in other ways throughout the school year.

We will have a time in our back-to-school bash to connect families and students with prayer champions from multiple generations. After we have prayer teams chosen, we will have a time for prayer champions to pray with their students before we depart. Will you pray for me? Please let Pastor Dave know if you are interested in being a prayer champion for 2021-2022 school year, and if you would like to connect with children/families or with youth.




The church celebrated Pentecost Sunday on May 23rd by singing several hymns as a congregation. We are so thankful to be able to sing together once again!
